Reading: Wilson, *The Gothic Cathedral*, "Introduction," 7-12 and "Early Gothic," 13-around 40.

- Basis of Wilson's thesis: competition between regions and communities. Constraint and choice on the part of builders and patrons/
- The emergence of Paris fostered by the growth of Capetian monarchy. A line of increasingly powerful kings starting with Louis VI 1108-37
- Wilson makes his case based upon careful descriptive juxtapositions

- 1. Bay system
- 2. Masonry vaulting; development of rib vaults
- 3. Elimination of wall
- 4. Transformation of classical orders to form a new fictive language
- 5. Development of the structural potential of the middle level--support hidden in gallery
